GASLAMP SELECTS 5 MURAL CONTEST FINALISTS The City of San Diego and the Gaslamp Quarter Project Area Committee have announced the five finalists in the Gaslamp Quarter Murals Project.

The five finalists are: Heidi Hardin; John Hubbell; Jay Johnson/Gary Ghirardi; Dan Rice; David Robinson. Special recognition ws given to the following: Thomas Holder; Ellen Irvin; Sammy Pascarella.

These artists will be commissioned (\$2,000 each) to paint outdoor murals on selected sites in the historic Gaslamp Quarter district this summer. The site locations of the murals are still being

negotiated with local property owners.

The five finalists were chosen from 15 semi-finalists, who had been selected from the original 71 artists who submitted resumes and letters of interest. Designs were judged on the following:

- 1. Quality of design.
- 2. Appropriateness to the Gaslamp Quarter and building.
- 3. Ability of artist to complete project.
